SOMETHING TO PONDER ON

The demands of the Gospel seem so total: to obtain the kingdom *one has to sell everything*. Yet it is also a process, a journey. What is most important is the movement and the direction of my life. Only the one who searches can find, those who are happy with where they are will never find anything worth giving their life for. Am I in a stagnant phase **or am I still searching, digging deeper** in the field of my heart?

Selling everything to obtain what they really desired so deeply filled both men in the parables with deep joy. This seems a contradiction, but this is what our experience tells us. As the prayer of St Francis puts it, It is in giving that we receive. I ask for a heart full of freedom, **freedom** to give all and to receive all.

Have I found the pearl of great value, for which I am ready to sell all I have to buy it? Am I still looking for it, *or am I resigned to a life of mediocrity* in my relationships with others, with God in my prayer, in my work life? If I have found it, am I ready, to sell all that I have to obtain it? Jesus compares this pearl to the Kingdom he came to proclaim and inaugurate, and this gives me joy and hope.

The parable is not inviting you to think about somebody else-some random trespasser. Jesus is inviting you to recognise where your heart is. For whom or for what would you go without everything else?
